Registration is free and the activities align with NCEA achievement standards in media studies, social studies, English, drama and music. Morning tea and lunch are provided.

At the conferences you will have the opportunity to ask questions about creative activism from a stellar panel of artists. There will be Kiwi artists in the room in person, plus international artists interacting with you via video link on the big screen.

The day includes performances from the top student finalists in the Create1World competition, and workshops with Massey lecturers in playwriting, creative writing, digital media production, social issue campaigning and more.

### Have you entered the Create1World competition yet?

The national competition is run in the lead-up to the conferences (open from September 1, 2018). It asks you to produce a creative piece that encourages audiences to join together as a global community and solve some of the big problems we face as a planet. It could be a video, song, poem, short story, speech or theatre performance – and you can use English, te reo Māori or New Zealand Sign Language. Your entry should help us think about ways of collaborating for the betterment of humanity on issues such as peace, equality, sustainable development, diversity, and climate change.
