WHY SHOULD WE DISCUSS RUSTIC BREEDS?

NUMERICALLY - MOST EWES MILKED IN EUROPE ARE FROM RUSTIC BREEDS = LARGE GENE POOL

RUSTIC BREEDS - GRAZE OUTDOORS IN A WIDE RANGE OF CLIMATES

INDOOR/INTENSIVE BREEDS - REQUIRE SOME DEGREE OF HOUSING

OUTDOOR GRAZING:

- MORE WEI FARE FRIENDLY
 - MAY BE LOWER COST
- WILL REQUIRE LESS STARTUP CAPITAL
 - MAY REQUIRE LESS LABOUR
 - MAY BE MORE PROFITABLE

BREEDS

- LACAUNE
- EAST FRIESIAN
 - ASSAF
- IMPROVED CHIOS

CHARACTERISTICS


- INDOOR/HYBRID SYSTEM
- SOFT, NEED GOOD MANAGEMENT
 - HIGHER YIELDING > 350L
- MEDIUM TO LONG LACTATION 170 330 days
 - FORAGE, CUT AND CARRY CONCETRATE
 - OFTEN INTRODUCED TO THE REGION

EXTENSIVE

MOST NUMEROUS BREEDS.

- SARDA
- COMMISANA
 - MASSESE
- MANCHEGO
 - CHURRA
 - LAXTA
- MANECH TETE ROUSSE/NOIR
 - BASCO-BEARNAISE
 - CHIOS

CHARACTERISTICS

- OUTDOOR SYSTEM
- LOW YIELDING <250L
- SHORT LACTATION: OFTEN <180 DAYS
 - GRASS, FORAGE BASED
 - WALKED OUT WITH A SHEHERD
 - REGIONAL
 - TRADITIONAL TO THE REGION
- ARE MORE FORGIVING WHEN TIMES ARE TOUGH

GENERAL CHARACTERISTICS OF RUSTIC BREEDS

- LOW YIELDING <250 LITRES
- SHORT LACTATION <180 DAYS
- GOOD UDDER CONFORMATION
 - GOOD FEET AND LEGS
- OFTEN (NOT ALWAYS) HIGH TOTAL SOLIDS
 - MAY HAVE HORNS
 - THICK BIRTH COAT
- USUALLY NON SEASONAL AS LAMB IN AUTUMN

RUSTIC BREEDS: LIMITS TO PRODUCTION

MILK PRODUCTION MAY BE LIMITED IN EUROPE :

- GENETIC POTENTIAL NOT STRETCHED
- ONLY A SMALL % HISTORICALLY WELL RECORDED
- NOT ALL MACHINE MILKED
- GRAZING POOR QUALITY PASTURE → MANY STEPS PER MOUTHFUL

RUSTIC BREEDS IN NEW ZEALAND - PROS

- ADAPTED TO WALKING GOOD FEET AND LEGS
- ADAPTED TO GRAZING GOOD TEETH AND MOUTH STRUCTURE
- ADAPTED TO LAMBING OUTSIDE GOOD BIRTH COAT ON LAMBS
- OFTEN BETTER PIGMENT / HAIR COVER OF EARS LESS SUNBURN
- VERY GOOD UDDER CONFORMATION NO SAGGY UDDERS
- OFTEN HAVE HIGH TOTAL SOLIDS GOOD FOR CHEESE MAKING
- MORE TOLERANT OF TOUGH CONDITIONS AND POORER PASTURE

RUSTIC BREEDS IN NEW ZEALAND - CONS

- LOW MILK YIELDS
- SHORT LACTATIONS
- SOME HAVE LOW BODY WEIGHT = UNSUITBALE CARCASS LAMB
- OFTEN HAVE HORNS
- OFTEN VERY POOR QUALITY CARCASS

WHAT ROLE CAN RUSTIC BREEDS PLAY?

CREATE A HYBRID WITH HIGH PRODUCING INDOOR BREEDS

RUSTIC BREED PROVIDES FUNCTIONALITY AND HARDINESS

• INTENSIVE BREED PROVIDES MILK YIELD, SIZE AND GROWTH RATE

The Manech cross in New Zealand

New Zealand Experience to date

- 100% survival from birth to weaning of 60 Manech x pregnancies scanned
- Rain not a problem
- Short ears, no sunburn
- Brown feet
- Good constitution

ITALY: Assaf x Massase

Massese (black) and Massese x Assaf (white) ewes waiting for milking



Information

- Massese are non seasonal, have very high total solids, very good feet, legs, udder conformation.
- Yield 150-250 litres in 180 days after suckling lamb for 30 days.
- Assaf x Massese yields 50-100 litres more per lactation and has a meatier faster growing lamb.

ALSO CONSIDER

NEW ZEALAND WILL HAVE BETTER PASTURES:

- = MORE MOUTHFULLS of GRASS PER MINUTE WHEN GRAZING
- = MORE MILK FROM RUSTIC BREEDS AND THEIR CROSSES THAN IN EUROPE.

PARTS OF NEW ZEALAND WILL HAVE AN EASIER CLIMATE

- **= WARMER WINTERS AND COOLER SUMMERS**
- = MORE MILK.

The future

High yielding pure Lacaune or East Friesian will not suit every system.

Which Rustic cross will be best suited to New Zealand conditions?

- Manech x Lacaune ewe hoggets will be milked on two sites in 2020.
- Massese x Lacaune, Massese x Assaf and Sarda x Lacaune embryos will be implanted in 2021.
- Ultimately time will tell. Possibly a 25% Rustic, 75% intensive breed hybrid might be best suited.
